Week	Focus	Goals and Tasks	Supervision Level
1	Observation & Orientation	 Observe daily routines and procedures. Learn about documentation and patient flow. Review safety protocols. 	100% Observation
2	Observation & Limited Participation	 Begin assisting with minor tasks (e.g., prepping materials, observing assessments). 	Mostly Observation (90%)
3	Direct Supervision & Hands-On Practice	 Begin conducting parts of sessions with guidance. Start documentation with feedback. 	Direct Supervision (75%)
4	Increased Participation	 Conduct full sessions under close supervision. Manage full documentation for specific cases. 	Direct Supervision (60%)
5	Building Confidence & Competence	 Manage a few cases with increased independence. Receive feedback on treatment and documentation. 	Moderate Supervision (50%)
6	Expanding Caseload	 Increase caseload and maintain regular documentation. Implement and adapt treatment plans independently. 	Moderate Supervision (40%)
7	Enhanced Clinical Skills	 Handle most cases independently. Seek feedback as needed on complex cases. 	Periodic Supervision (30%)
8	Managing a Full Caseload	 Full caseload management. Independently handle documentation and patient interaction with minimal guidance. 	Limited Supervision (20%)

9	Refining Skills	 Continue with full caseload. Focus on treatment refinement and advanced documentation skills. 	Limited Supervision (10-20%)
10	Independent Practice	 Work independently; supervisor available for check-ins. Implement advanced techniques and adapt treatment. 	Minimal Supervision (10%)
11	Advanced Competence	 Function fully independently, using the supervisor as a resource. Refine problem-solving and critical thinking. 	Minimal Supervision (5-10%)
12	Final Review & Reflection	 Conduct a final review with the supervisor. Reflect on growth and prepare for future independent practice. 	Supervisor as Resource (5%)
