Supervision Guide

During Level II fieldwork experiences, the fieldwork educator determines caseload progression and when it is appropriate to decrease supervision based upon the student's skill level. However, here is a guideline for caseload progression and supervision throughout the rotation.

Supervision Guideline

Direct-Constant (close proximity/direct contact with client 75 - 100% of the time)

Direct-Moderate (close proximity/direct contact with client 50 – 75% of the time)

Direct-Half (close proximity/direct contact with client less than 50% of the time)

Indirect (present in session/role modeling when needed)

Line-of-Sight (present in room/little intervention is needed)

Entry-level practice (as little supervision as permitted by payer sources, medical board, etc.)

Week 1: Observation/orientation; 1st session on Day 3

Direct (close proximity/direct contact with client 75 - 100% of the time)

Week 2: 20% of caseload

Direct (close proximity/direct contact with client 75 - 100% of the time)

Week 3: 30% of caseload

Direct (close proximity/direct contact with client 50 – 75% of the time)

Week 4: 40% of caseload

Direct (close proximity/direct contact with client 50 – 75% of the time)

Week 5: 50% of caseload

Direct (close proximity/direct contact with client less than 50% of the time)

Week 6: 50% of caseload

Indirect (present in session/role modeling when needed)

Week 7: 75% of caseload

Indirect (present in session/role modeling when needed)

Week 8: 75% of caseload

Line-of-Sight (present in room/little intervention is needed)

Week 9: Full Caseload

Line-of-Sight (present in room/little intervention is needed)

Week 10: Full Caseload

Entry-level practice (as little supervision as permitted by payer sources, medical board, etc.)

Week 11: Full Caseload

Entry-level practice (as little supervision as permitted by payer sources, medical board, etc.)
